a lower level, a five-stop elevator (capable of accommodating four people), Wolf and Sub-Zero appliances, Porcelanosa Europeandesigned kitchen, flooring, tiles, Kohler fixtures, a two-car garage with an interior entrance into the home, ample custom closets, smart technology, a large roof deck, and much more.

Of course, a full 10-year tax abatement starts on a buyer's first day in their new home. Plus, buyers can pick every selection and color from a wide variety of samples, all choices within the base price of \$990,000 from an on-site showroom.

"When we developed the Reserve, the Villas, and the Regency, we designed different-style homes, so as not to hurt the resale values of the existing Packer Park homes," she says. "Now, if you want a flat condo, we have them. If you want a bi-level condo, we have them in this community. If you want a small, compact home to just retire, with low maintenance, all in a safe, green, convenient community, we have them. If your desire is for a large home, with most of the features that are in a \$2.4 million new home in Center City—double garages, elevators, roof decks—we have those, too, and for far more reasonable prices."

Capozzi designed Renaissance Estates to enhance Packer Park's endless charm, while adding to the suburban appeal that makes the area so unique. Her husband, Frank Scaramuzza, supervises the construction and oversees the curation of the Architectural Digest-worthy interiors. The exterior is brick, metal, and oversized windows, with no expense spared. A gorgeous private courtyard is in process. Inside, the buyers can customize the interiors to their desires: kitchen and bath cabinets, handles, the doors, the countertops, flooring, custom closets, more. Capozzi's anything-but-cookie-cutter mindset is a refreshing outlier in today's world, much like Packer Park's status as a wave-from-yourfront-stoop neighborhood.

Renaissance Estates' safe environs and central location make it an ideal destination for everyone from young professionals to families with children to empty-nest retirees. The area's diverse population includes police captains, attorneys, judges, entrepreneurs, and restaurateurs. Renaissance Estates is one block from the Olmstead-designed FDR Park, which includes a bird sanctuary, skateboard park, tennis courts, and fishable lakes. The park is now undergoing a \$200 million master-planned restoration with two large destination playgrounds, new ballfields, and pickleball and tennis courts, cafés, walking trails, a 5K running trail, and much more—making FDR Park South

Philadelphia's version of New York City's Central Park. In fact, FDR Park recently won the honor of hosting the PHS Philadelphia Flower Show in June, the first time the show will be held outdoors.

The community is also a short walk to the city's trio of professional sports and entertainment venues: Citizens Bank Park, Wells Fargo Center, and Lincoln Financial Field.
